Tom Perron,

It was great speaking to you. Please pass along the following information pertaining to Giants Neck Road closures. Enclosed you will find a map of Rocky Neck State Park that I have marked with arrows indicating which way to travel once inside the park.

In the event that we have another road closure of Giants Neck Road due to an emergency, there is an emergency access road that is located within the Rocky Neck State Park that comes out onto Giants Neck Road. The access road is for emergency use only. The Town of East Lyme had this road added (many, many years ago) in case of emergencies and road closures such as what Giants Neck Residents experienced a couple of weeks ago.

In the event of a closure, please do not attempt to bypass the Officer, cones and or barricades that are blocking the road at Giants Neck Road and West Main Street (156). The following would be the reason that the road is blocked at Giants Neck Road and West Main Street (156). The accident and or emergency had occurred between the beginning of Giants Neck Road at West Main Street (156) and Dell Lane. Therefore the detour through the park should be utilized. If you happen to reside between 156 and Dell Lane then you should stop and tell the officer the number of your residence so that he/she may allow you to proceed through the barricade with caution. The officer will know the numeric of the closest residence that the incident has occurred near. For example if the accident occurred near #54 Giants Neck Road and you live before that address the officer will allow you to bypass them to get to your residence. If you live beyond #58 you should use the detour to the access road within the park. If an accident or emergency occurs between Dell Lane and Griswold Drive, you would use Dell Lane and any of the roads in the heights to get to Griswold Drive and back out onto Giants Neck Road.

Residents should become familiar with the surrounding roads in their neighborhoods in the event of an emergency so that they can learn of an alternate route to evacuate if the need arises. Many businesses in town, the town hall, police department, community center and other town facilities have maps of the town usually in the reception area or main counter of the business or town office. This would be a good asset to have in your glove box of your vehicle in the event you do not have access to a digital version or if services go down.
